Addendum

1. The present addendum summarizes additional comments received from the Governments of Cuba and Hungary on the advisability and specific content of the draft minimum rules for the administration of criminal justice, bringing the number of Governments that have submitted replies to 52.
2. Cuba was in favour of the draft minimum rules, which, in its view, could be of great value in the formulation of basic principles for the administration of criminal justice. A group of experts charged with the review of the draft minimum rules could facilitate the development of a global vision of the complex issues involved. Cuba made various substantive remarks and suggestions regarding specific elements of the draft minimum rules.
3. Hungary supported the promulgation of the draft minimum rules, and considered it necessary to convene an expert group to review the proposed text. Hungary made various substantive comments and suggestions regarding specific elements of the draft minimum rules.
